Elizabeth "Bette" (Noble) Swanson, 87, formerly of Sult Road, Millville, Greenwood Township, died early Monday morning, May 12, 2014 at the Orangeville Health and Rehabilitation Center where she had been a resident since March 12th.

Born August 18, 1926 in Jamaica Plains, Massachusetts she was a daughter of the late James and Mary Noble. She and her late husband, Wesley, owned and operated the Log Home Bed and Breakfast in Greenwood Township from 1990 to 2003.

She was a dog lover and especially enjoyed her golden retrievers. She also enjoyed being a homemaker and was known for her cooking, baking and knitting.

Mrs. Swanson was of the Roman Catholic faith.
