



Eulalia H. (Sutliff) Bogart

March 14, 1915 - August 14, 2013

Eulalia H. (Sutliff) Bogart, 98, of Ridge Road, Orangeville (Jonestown), died Wednesday morning, August 14th, 2013 at her home surrounded by her family. She had lived in Jonestown for most of her life.

Born March 14, 1915 in Waller, Jackson Township, she was a daughter of the late William "Bill" Sutliff and Jennie (Laubach) Sutliff. She was preceded in death by her husband, whom she married on August 15, 1939, Raymond "Dutch" Bogart, on May 11, 1974.

Mrs. Bogart graduated from the former Jonestown one room school where she attended for 8 years. She later graduated from the former Union High School in Fishing Creek Township in 1930 and then from Benton High School in 1932.

She enjoyed being a homemaker and also did some cleaning for various homes and offices in the area.

Mrs. Bogart was a member of the Jonestown United Methodist Church. Her hobbies included gardening, flowers, word puzzles, watching baseball games (except the Atlanta Braves) and quilting. Most of all she enjoyed spending time with her family and friends. She was often referred to as the lady that was always smiling.

Surviving are her six children: Shirley Roberts and her husband, Allen, of Montrose, Colorado; Donald Bogart and his wife, Deborah, of Palmyra; Louise Rhinard and her husband, Glen, of Jonestown; Robert Bogart and his wife, Joan, of Stillwater; David Bogart of Berwick; Rodney Bogart and his wife, Sharon, of Stillwater. Also surviving are 9 grandchildren, 5 great grandchildren and several nieces and nephews.

In addition to her husband, she was preceded in death by a brother, Hurley Sutliff in 1967 and 2 sisters: Mildred Hartman in 1977 and Bertha Snyder in 1926.

Funeral Services will be held Monday, August 19th, 2013 at 3 PM at the McMichael Funeral Home, Inc., 4394 Red Rock Road, Benton (Rt. 487) with the Rev. Darwin C. Goshorn, her Pastor, officiating. Burial will be in the Jonestown Cemetery. A Viewing will be held Monday from 2 PM until the time of the Service at 3 at McMichael's.
