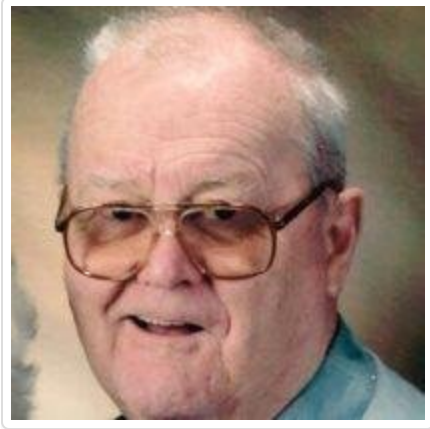




James J. "Jim" Stevenson
