



Dr. Jay E. Fleck Jr.

November 20, 1925 - June 30, 2014

Dr. Jay E. Fleck, Jr., 88, of Millville, died early Monday morning, June 30, 2014 at his home.

Born November 20, 1925 in Cleveland, Ohio, he was a son of the late Jay and Verna (Stitzel) Fleck. He was preceded in death by his wife, Nellie E. (Welker) Fleck, of 60 years, 7 months and 20 days on April 20, 2011.

Dr. Fleck was a graduate of Huntingdon High School, Juniata College and Temple University School of Dentistry. He began his dental practice in Millville in 1954 where he practiced for 34 years until his retirement in July 1988 .

He faithfully served his country in the U. S. Army during World War II serving in the 100th Infantry Division.

Dr. Fleck was a member of the First Baptist Church of Danville. He was also a member of Oriental Lodge No. 460, F. & A. M., Orangeville; the Millville Fire Company and the Millville American Legion.

Surviving are his 4 children: Jennifer Defreitas and her husband, Keith, of Matthews, NC; James J. Fleck, of Charlotte, NC; Joseph Fleck, of Millville; George H. Fleck and his wife, Susan, of Cumming, GA; 5 grandchildren: Jason, Elizabeth, Sarah, Zachary, and Zoey and 3 great grandchildren.

Graveside Services will be held Thursday at 10:30 AM at the Millville Cemetery. The Rev. Dawes Dunham, First Baptist Church of Danville, will officiate.
