Leah E. (Enterline) Walker, 95, formerly of Mahoning Manor (Penn Street), Milton, passed away, Monday, November 11, 2013 surrounded by her daughter, Janie and family.

Leah was born on July 22, 1918. She was the fourth of eleven children born to the late William F. and Jeanett (Ritter) Enterline.
