



Mr. Luther L. "Luke" Lowe

July 3, 1930 - April 6, 2012

Luther L. "Luke" Lowe, 81, formerly of Rohrsburg, died late Friday evening, April 6th, 2012 at the Orangeville Nursing and Rehabilitation Center where he had been a resident for the past several years.

Born July 3, 1930 in Bloomsburg, he was a son of the late Richard Z. and Celia Edna (Beaver) Lowe. He was preceded in death by his wife, Shirley J. (Fisher) Lowe, on June 28, 2006 and by a sister, Joy Parker.

He attended a one-room school house in Greenwood, then attended the Rohrsburg and Benton Schools and later graduated from Millville High School in 1948.

Mr. Lowe had been employed by Wise/Borden of Berwick for 17 years. He had earlier worked for the Magee Carpet Company in Bloomsburg, Girton Manufacturing in Millville and Kennedy Van Saun of Danville.

Luke proudly served his country in the U.S. Army during the Korean War and had been awarded the Korean Service Medal. He was an active member of the Benton V. F. W., the Millville American Legion and was an active participant with local military funerals.

He was an active member of the Derrs Christian Church where he had served as a Deacon and was involved with various church activities. He was also a member of the former Bloomsburg Moose Lodge.

Surviving are his two daughters: Laurie Wiest, of Harrisburg and Kim M. Lowe, of Cody, Wyoming; a sister, Linda Quatrone, of San Antonio, Texas.

Funeral Services will be held Wednesday, April 11th, 2012 at 2 P. M. at the McMichael Funeral Home, Inc., 4394 Red Rock Road, Benton (Rt. 487) with Pastor Robert Andrews and Pastor Mark Stoker, officiating. Burial will be in Élan Memorial Park with full military honors accorded by a combined veterans group. A viewing will be held Wednesday from 1 PM until the time of the Service at 2:00 at McMichael's.
